



Scottish Engineering Special Leaders Award for STEM

If you could be an engineer in Scotland - what would you do?

We challenge Primary and Secondary school pupils in Scotland to research and interview inspiring engineers!

The Challenge

Pupils are asked to research engineering and interview a practicing engineer to interpret the statement "If I could be an engineer in Scotland – what would I do?".

Primary pupils are asked to illustrate their response, accompanied by **100 words**.

Secondary pupils are asked to illustrate their response, accompanied by **350 words**.

This award is a great opportunity to engage pupils with real engineers who will convey the importance of STEM in their daily working lives. Schools will be able to develop relationships with industry, both local and worldwide, giving pupils a unique perspective of professions and their significance in the wider world.
